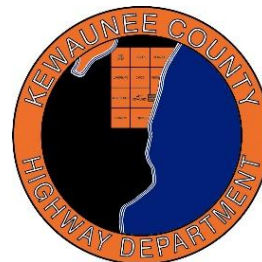

IMPLEMENTS OF HUSBANDRY (IOH) POLICY

Proposed Effective Date: 1/1/2026

Excessive Size and Weight

The Highway Department does not require a permit for IOH equipment that exceeds the weight limits established by Wisconsin DOT at this time. This memo does not apply to commercial carriers. The limits are such that most vehicles will not exceed, and the State has prohibited a County from charging a fee for such permits, meaning we cannot recoup losses for administration of this program. It was therefore determined by the Highway Board at its September 2024 meeting to discontinue the permitting process unless, or until, changes are made to the program. If a farmer requires a permit, the County will issue a Vehicles and Loads of Excessive Size and Weight Permit at no charge.


Utility & ROW Policy (Fluid Transfer Lines pumped from Right-of-Way)

Agriculture users may apply for an Annual Service Connection Permit under the County adopted fee schedule with an exception being made for the Service Connection Project Authorization, that fee will be waived for agriculture. Other terms and requirements for the permit will still apply including the submittal of a Traffic Control Plan. Mapping will be done using the Kewaunee County GIS page - <https://kewauneeco.ags.ruekert-mielke.com/> under the IoH Viewer Tab. The Utility Permit Ag Attachment form will be filled out and included with the Annual Service Connection Permit and the Traffic Control Plan for each site allowing the County to enter the map location. Additional resources and training for haulers and agriculture users on requirements for a Traffic Control Plan are available through UW Extension.


If adjustments need to be made to approved sites due to conditions, the site may be shifted up to 200 feet, provided there are no changes in the road that would drive an adjustment of the Traffic Control Plan. If an adjustment affects the approved Traffic Control Plan, then coordination will need to happen with the Highway Department. If after hours, call 920-388-3707 and press option #7 for the stand-by person. Additionally, permit holders are responsible to ensure that route restrictions and road/bridge ratings are followed when determining their route of travel. Mapping will be done using the Kewaunee County GIS page - <https://kewauneeco.ags.ruekert-mielke.com/> under the IoH Viewer Tab. If route restrictions are not followed, it invalidates the permit, and the non-permitted site fee will apply.
