9.01 State Traffic Code Adopted. The Kewaunee County Board of Supervisors adopts the provisions of this Ordinance pursuant to the authority of Wis. Stats. §349.06.

- (1) Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Code, the statutory provisions in Chapters 341 to 348 of the Wisconsin Statutes, describing and defining regulations with respect to vehicles and traffic, and Chapter 350 of the Wisconsin Statutes describing and defining regulations with respect to snowmobiles, are adopted and by reference made a part of this code as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated herein by reference is required or prohibited by this code. Any future amendments, revisions or modifications of the statutes incorporated herein are intended to be made a part of this Code in order to secure uniform statewide regulation of traffic on the highways, streets and alleys of the State and uniform statewide regulations of snowmobile use.

9.02 Uniform Deposit Schedule Adopted.

- (1) Any forfeiture for a violation for the State Statutes adopted by reference herein in s. 9.01 of this Chapter shall conform to the forfeiture permitted to be imposed for violation of such statutes as set forth in the uniform deposit and misdemeanor bail schedule of the Wisconsin Judicial Conference, including any variations or increases for subsequent offenses, which schedule is adopted by reference.

9.03 Severability. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors for Kewaunee County would have passed the other provisions of this ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid and if any provision of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be effected thereby.
