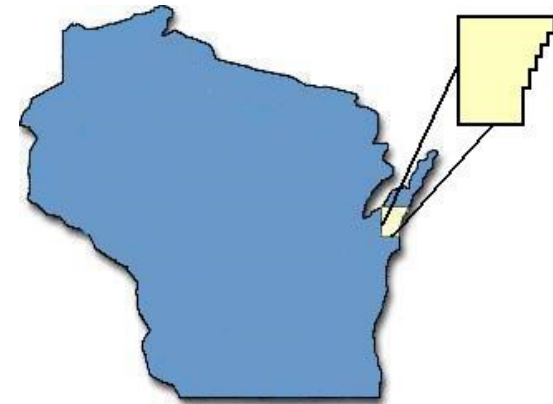

Senior Nutrition Program:

- Hot lunches are served to individuals 60 years of age and older, any aged spouse attending with their spouse who is 60 years or older; a person with a disability, under age 60, who resides in a housing facility at which a dining site is located or a disabled individual who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program.

Kewaunee County Department of Human Services— Transportation Program:

- **Driver Escort Program** utilizes volunteer drivers and their personal vehicles to provide transportation to ambulatory seniors 55+ years or older.
- Call 920-388-0626 or 920-255-7251 to schedule a ride. Requests must be made 24 hours in advance and rides are provided Monday through Thursday 8:00 am to 3:00 pm and Fridays 8:00 am to 1:00 pm excluding holidays. Transportation requests are coordinated on a first request, first served basis.
- A donation is requested from the participant. (within the City limits: \$5.00; within Kewaunee County: \$10.00; outside Kewaunee County \$20.00) (Limited to Brown, Door and Manitowoc counties)
- **Algoma Bus Service** is a door to door service, with no regular route schedule. The service is available to seniors, age 55+ years and individuals with disabilities within the city limits of Algoma. The bus is wheelchair accessible.
- The bus runs Wednesday and Friday from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm. Ride requests should be made to 920-388-0626 or 920-255-7251 to dispatch the driver. Suggested bus donation is \$1.00 per stop.

The Transportation Program attempts to accommodate all requests from eligible participants for transportation to and from medical and/or nutrition related activities. Transportation requests can be declined if there are no available drivers.

Home Delivered Meals:

- Provided to individuals who are unable to attend the dining sites and who meet homebound eligibility requirements.
- Eligibility: Persons age 60 and older who are homebound; any aged spouse living with their spouse who is 60 years or older and eligible for the program; and a person with a disability who resides at home with an eligible adult age 60 or older who is participating in the program.
- Meals are delivered in the City limits of Algoma and Kewaunee; Monday through Friday, except Holidays. For rural Kewaunee County residents; frozen meals will be delivered on Monday, including five (5) meals per delivery day.
- Meals are scheduled to arrive at the participant's home between 11 am and 1 pm. (Algoma and Kewaunee hot meals), but may vary due to necessary changes or delay in the delivery route.

Farm Market Nutrition Program:

- The Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program allows senior citizens, age 60 or above (Native Americans age 55 years or above) to apply for vouchers that are used to purchase fresh, unprocessed, Wisconsin-grown fruits, vegetables and herbs from "certified" farm markets and roadside stands.
- Eligible participants need to have an income at or below the qualifying income schedule. This schedule changes from year to year.
- The Farmers' Market vouchers are available on a limited, first come, first served basis. ADRC staff complete applications at various locations around the county. Dates and locations are announced as soon as the information is available.
