Current and future workshops include: • Caring For Children Who Have Experienced Trauma – 16 hour workshop, 5 weekly sessions; • Powerful Tools for Caregivers of Children With Special Health Needs – 12 hour workshop, 6 weekly sessions; • Parents Forever – 4 hour class, 2 nightly sessions; • Mental Health First Aid – 8 hour course, 2 nightly sessions; Aging Mastery – 12 hours, 6 weekly sessions
